
Wing Trap - ASSEMBLY & USE


Item List: Trap Top • Trap Bottom • 2 Plastic Straw Spacers • Wire Hanger • Lure Holder





Fold top inward along each of the four diagonal creases.

Straighten wire hanger and insert ends through holes in trap top. Bring ends through holes in side panels from the inside and push the wire hanger down as far as possible.






Fold down end flaps on trap top.

Thread lure holder onto either one of the wire ends using end of lure holder with one small hole. This allows lure to be suspended between top and bottom of trap.

Slide each straw spacer up the wire ends.





With sticky side up, fold the side panels of one of the trap bottoms inward, and fold end flaps upward.

Insert wire ends through the holes in side panels from the outside and through the lower holes from the inside.

Slide the trap bottom up snug to the straw spacers. Bend the end of the wires upward.



To hang, wrap twisted part of wire hanger securely around a tree limb or other support.




Remove one lure from foil pouch. Attach lure to lure holder as follows:

Rubber Septa Lure:

Fit into either A of B of lure holder.

Fiber Lure:

Remove backing from lure and adhere to end of lure holder, covering A and B.



Without lure holder, attach lure to trap as follows:

Fiber Lure:

Remove backing from lure and adhere to inside surface of trap top.

All Other Lures:

Place on sticky surface of trap bottom, taking care not to coat the surface of the lure with the glue from the trap.

NOTE: To prolong storage life, refrigerate or freeze unused lures in their sealed pouch.

To avoid cross-contamination, only handle traps and lures for one specific insect species at a time. Wash hands and working surfaces thoroughly before assembling and baiting traps for other species.

To inspect trap and remove insects, and to re-bait trap, straighten one wire end and lower trap bottom on that side. For further use, return bottom, spacer and wire to their original positions.
