MOTH BORER FACTS

Clear-winged moths of the Borer Family damage many types of trees when their larvae tunnel into roots and trunks. Moth Borers such as Peach Tree Borer, Dogwood Borer, Western & Eastern Lilac Borer, Rhododendron Borer and other Borer moths can be monitored with the Peach Tree Borer Trap. Apply appropriate controls when moths are caught.

EASY INSTRUCTIONS

Attach hanger. Grasp trap by top and bottom flaps. Pull apart to form trap (do not touch glue). Open lure packet; place one lure on the inside, upper surface of the trap (Do not touch the attractant lure). Hang the trap in your tree. Moths may be captured at any time through the growing season. Place the trap 1 to 2 feet inside the tree canopy. Place traps in trees 1 or 2 weeks before bud break, in early spring. Check for moths every 2 to 3 days and apply appropriate treatments to control moths. Recycle or dispose of traps when full of insects, or at least every 3 months.

In case of contact, remove glue with vegetable oil.


